

School Uniform - Kerikeri High School

Kerikeri High School is a school where school uniform is expected to be worn neatly and completely at school, travelling to and from school, and at school functions.

If there is a good reason why some item of uniform cannot be worn, a note must be brought from home to the Dean and a short term exemption will be issued or the problem followed up in some other way.

Jewellery is discouraged. Students may wear a plain flat ring, small simple ear keepers (only one in each ear), and a wrist watch. Crosses and bone or greenstone taonga may be worn. Extremes of hair style could result in the student being removed from classes. Make-up may not be worn when a student is in school uniform. The Board of Trustees reserves the right to decide what is an acceptable standard of appearance.

The school completed a full review of the school uniform in 2003 and, after consultation with parents and students, the following uniform items were adopted.

Jersey: Official jade green

Sweatshirt: Official jade green

Shirts: Summer:
Knit short sleeved sport shirt – white or jade
Winter:
Knit short sleeved sport shirt – white or jade
OR Skivvy – white
OR Long sleeved dress shirt – white
(seniors only) with tie

N.B. Shirts must not be untucked and visible when under jerseys, sweatshirts and jackets.

Jacket: Official school jacket
Any non-uniform jacket may only be worn while student is going to and from school.

Tie: Official school tie

Shoes: Regulation black lace-up flat soled Kerikeri High School shoes. There is an approved range of styles available at local shoe shops or regulation shoes can be ordered through the school Uniform Shop. Details of approved styles are available at the Uniform Shop or at Reception. Should a student have a confirmed medical problem with footwear it is expected that students wear alternative appropriate black shoes.

Sandals: Plain black flat soled or any “reef” style sandals that are mainly black. (No jandals or scuffs). Sandals may not be worn with trousers.

**Students may choose to wear the above with the following options.
All must be in official fabrics and styles.**

Navy Dress Shorts: Official fabrics (All year levels)

Navy Skirt: Pleated (3 box pleats). Length between 5cm above and 5cm below the knee. (All year levels)

Navy Dress Trousers: Dress trousers must be tidy, properly hemmed and may not be worn rolled up. (All year levels)

Navy Trackpants: Years 7, 8 and 9 only. Terms 2 and 3 only.

Socks: Boys:
White sports socks or long navy school socks may be worn with shoes with the shorts option. Navy or black socks to be worn with trouser option.

Socks/Tights: Girls:
White socks to be worn with shoes OR in winter approved navy tights may be worn if preferred with skirt. Socks and tights may not be worn together. Navy or black socks to be worn with trouser option.

Physical Education: Navy knit shorts and White or Navy Tee-Shirt or singlet.

Hats: Sun hats may be worn – no other hats may be worn. Hats are not to be worn indoors.

Scarf: A plain Navy scarf may be worn. Scarves are not to be worn indoors.

Please ensure all items of clothing are suitably named.

As students and parents have played a large part in selecting this uniform, we hope students will enjoy wearing it and take a pride in their appearance.

Year 13 Dress Code

Year Thirteen students may wear tidy daywear, provided that they present themselves well. As for other students at school, we expect Year Thirteen students to be neat, clean and to take a pride in their appearance. Jandals, scuffs, work boots and socks, beachwear, collarless T-shirts, beanies, facial piercings, bare midriffs and clothing with large advertising logos are not permitted.
