### MICROSOFT OFFICE 365 AND STUDENT EMAIL ACCOUNTS

Kerikeri High School has established Microsoft Office 365 accounts for all of our students. These allow all Kerikeri High School students a school email address, as well as cloud storage via One Drive and access to Microsoft Office Web Apps via Office Online. All students are also able to download and install a full version of Microsoft Office on up to five different devices, including computers, tablets and iPads through the Microsoft Student Advantage programme. Having a school email address and Office 365 account means that students have access to a range of online tools to support their learning anytime, anywhere.

### YEAR 7 – 10 MATHEMATICS

An email was sent to all parents with regards to the general overview of the Mathematics programme for years 7 – 10. Included in this email was a link that allows for parents to sign up to Education Perfect, which is the digital platform the students will be using for homework throughout the year. The voluntary School Contribution is very important to the school. This contribution can be claimed as a donation for tax purposes.

The School Contribution is used to pay the huge number of extra services and activities at this School for which we receive no Government funds. We need accurate records in the event of an emergency, so it is really important that the school is informed of:

- **Change of address/circumstances**
- **Change of telephone numbers (work or home)**

### **EDUCATION OUTSIDE THE CLASSROOM / EOTC**

We do run an extensive Education Outside the Classroom programme that includes everything from routine field work to after school sailing, camps, tramps and weekend sports events. Permission for routine and low risk activities is given on enrolment and we will contact parents for permission for each major or higher risk EOTC event before it occurs.

### **KERIKERI HIGH SCHOOL BUS BAY**

The Bus Bay at the front of Kerikeri High School only just accomodates the buses for the High School and Primary School. Even one single car parked there at bus times means that buses are left blocking Hone Heke Road. Please keep clear as directed by the signs between 8.00am and 10.00am in the morning and between 2.00pm and 4.00pm in the afternoon.

### **DON'T FORGET – PLEASE KEEP TURNING LEFT**

Traffic congestion in Hone Heke Road is a major concern – please remember the “Left Turn Only” rule between the hours of 8.15am – 9.00am and 2.45pm – 3.45pm. This rule covers the area from Oripiro Road past the entrance to the Kerikeri High School Tennis Courts and Community Swimming Pool.

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## School Bus Information

The main school bus service in the Kerikeri schools area is provided by the Ministry of Education, to assist eligible students to travel from their home to school. Funding provided is managed by the Kerikeri Schools Transport Network (KSTN) who contract Clarks Coachlines to provide the service. Clarks Coachlines provide us with an extremely efficient service, with a modern well maintained and impeccably presented fleet of buses.

**For a student to be eligible** for School Transport Allowance a student must be attending the closest suitable mainstream state or state-integrated school they can enrol at, and students from Years 1-8 must live more than 3.2km from the closest school they can enrol at, and students from Years 9 or over must live more than 4.8km from the closest school they can enrol at. Each school is surrounded by a Transport Entitlement Zone which is defined by the mid-point between the school and the next similar school. Note that the Transport Entitlement Zone is not necessarily the same as the School's enrolment zone, and in fact is different for Kerikeri High School in both the Haruru Falls and Takou areas.

**Eligible students residing within the Transport Entitlement Zone** will usually be able to use a bus service near them. However the Ministry of Education reserve the right to provide a transport assistance allowance in lieu of a bus if it is uneconomic to operate a bus for a few students. This is currently the case in the Purerua peninsula area. Note that students are expected by the Ministry of Education to walk up to 2.4km to their bus stop, so routes usually do not extend to the Transport Entitlement Zone boundaries.

**Students who reside outside the Transport Entitlement Zone.** Currently we have conflicting information from the Ministry and in the KSTN agreement with the Ministry regarding whether students who live outside the school's Transport Entitlement Zone are still entitled to some assistance. At the time of writing the Ministry have not answered our queries on this subject.

**A Transport Assistance Allowance** is sometimes paid to parents who need to convey students more than 2.4km to meet a bus. Application forms for a transport allowance are available from Reception and need to be returned to the school. After verification they are forwarded to the Ministry of Education who determine whether they are accepted. Allowances are paid to caregivers each term in arrears.

**Caregivers should apply for the transport allowance in Term One** to ensure the full annual allowance is received. Once approved the allowance remains active until the student leaves school or changes their address. Even if remaining eligible a new application must be made for a new address.

Most routes have comfortable loadings, although it is becoming increasingly difficult to meet our desired policy of having all students seated. All drivers have strict instruction to not ever exceed the legal loadings. Most buses are licenced to carry around 20 standing student passengers. Our policy is to have all primary students seated.

Loading the large number of students efficiently and safely onto buses at the end of the day is a challenge. The twenty buses will not all fit in the bus bay so they arrive at set staggered times. As the first buses move out the next wave of buses arrives. If even a single car is parked in the Bus Bay the process is considerably slower, leaving buses on Hone Heke Road unable to enter the Bay and blocking all road traffic. Please do not park in the Bay between the times displayed on the signs. Registration numbers of cars impeding the buses are passed on to the Police and tickets have been issued in the past.

Where space is available, for example after offloading students at Riverview, the KSTN allows non-eligible student passengers for a small fare, currently \$1 per ride within the 4.8 km area, and \$2 outside that.

This service is very limited and not guaranteed, as the eligible user numbers vary day-by-day, and is not available if these additional students significantly increase the number of standing passengers. All fares collected are used to improve the service.

Occasionally in the past students have used the KSTN service to travel to the Waipapa sports grounds for training. Unfortunately because of loadings no space is available on any bus serving Waipapa so this service is no longer available for casual passengers.

All queries regarding the bus services need to be made to the student's school. The contractors are not able to make decisions about routes, or casual passengers.

In addition to the KSTN bus service, there are Clarks Coachline buses serving the Paihia, Opuā Kawakawa and Kaikohe areas, Stewarts serving Kaeo, and a service to Whatuwhiwhi. All these are fare-paying services.

## YEAR 7 and 8 School Immunisation Programme

Date: 11/02/2019

Dear Parent/Guardian

**Year 7 boys and girls** are being offered the Boostrix Vaccine, which protects against Tetanus, Diphtheria and Pertussis (whooping cough). This is a booster for the vaccinations they received in early childhood.

**Year 8 boys and girls** are being offered the HPV (Human Papillomavirus) immunisation to help protect them against infection from nine types of HPV that lead to cancers of the cervix, throat, mouth, genital and anal areas in both men and women. Some HPV types can also cause genital warts in both men and women.

Parents have a choice of having their children vaccinated against these diseases either at their General Practitioners or with their Public Health Nurse at school.

**Note: These vaccinations are free wherever you choose to go.**

Please take the time to go online and watch the following Youtube videos about the vaccinations with your children. The videos talk about why we recommend these immunisations and how immunity works.

## **Kerikeri High School Representative Hoodie Criteria**

Kerikeri High School Representative Hoodies are available for students who meet the schools approved criteria, as described below. These hoodies are not part of the official school uniform, as they are subject to fading if worn regularly, and so are not suitable as a permanent uniform item. Students are currently permitted to wear their approved Kerikeri High School hoodies at school however.

The intention of the hoodies is to provide students who represent the school and meet the hoodie criteria with a comfortable and appropriate casual garment that they can wear to mid-week and weekend school sports fixtures, and qualifying Four Cornerstone events.

The school reserves the right to review and amend the criteria for Representative Hoodies as needed.

To qualify for a Representative Kerikeri High School Hoodie students will:

- be in a selected team which represents the school on a regular basis– this can include individual sports, eg Athletics, Tennis etc if the students represent the Kerikeri High School at Northland Secondary Schools Association or National events .
- or be involved in a Four Cornerstone activity representing the school on a regular basis, in a selected group or individual activity. This can include Debating, Kapa Haka, Jazz Band, Rock Quest, Student Librarian, Student Council

All Representative Hoodies must have at least one qualifying Four Cornerstone activity listed under the school logo.

Subsequent qualifying activities may be added to the Representative Hoodie over time, with a formal letter from the school approving the addition(s).

New Representative Hoodies may have qualifying Four Cornerstone activities added retrospectively with formal written approval from the school.

All Representative Hoodies must have the students initials embroidered on the back right of the hoodie.

The embroidering of Representative Hoodies is included in the cost of the garment, and Representative Hoodies will not be distributed to students without the relevant details included on them.

Hoodies are purchased on the understanding they are unique to the purchasing student and are not transferable to siblings, friends etc.

Hoodies must be ordered through the Kerikeri High School Sports Office.
