As well as many varieties of fish there was a lot of different marine life seen including dolphins, seals and the odd marlin jumping. Senior SAVE Group

Our Senior SAVE (Save All Viable Environments) Group has done some great mahi this term including raising funds for recycling units for our senior form classes, creating tie dye that is being sold in the central Hospice Shop to raise money to support the work they do. The students have set goals for the rest of the year including recycling, minimising waste and educating staff and students about environmental issues.

KK4 Bus Change

For students who catch the KK4 bus, which heads out along Purerua Road and on to Te Tii, there will be a slight change to departure times from Kerikeri High School in the afternoon. From the beginning of Term 2 this bus will leave approximately 5 minutes earlier than it has been. It will become one of the first buses to leave. Students who catch this bus should take this into account after school to make sure they arrive promptly after class to the bus lines to ensure they do not miss it. We have shared this with students in the Daily Notices this week.

PE Uniform

Our new Physical Education uniform is now available at the Uniform Shoppe in Waipapa. Our expectation is that all students in Years 7, 8, 9 and 10 will be wearing correct PE uniform from the beginning of Term 2. If there are difficulties with the cost of the PE uniform, please contact your child's Year Level Dean or Health and Physical Education teacher in confidence.

School Representative Hoodies

Kerikeri High School Representative Hoodies are available for students who meet the schools approved criteria, as described on the school website. The student must have achieved a qualifying cornerstone in at least one of our Four School Cornerstones - Cultural, Sporting, Academic and Leadership. Approval Letters have been given out to our qualifying Year 7 students and all other year levels can get an Approval Letter from our Sports Office. This letter is to be taken to The Uniform Shoppe in Waipapa where the hoodies can be purchased from. There is a 3 - 4week turnaround for hoodies due to the personalised embroidering required.

Monday 24 April Teacher Only Day

Monday 24 April is a Teacher Only Day and we will not be open for supervision of students. Our staff will be involved in professional learning about Restorative Practice as we work to embed this across our school over the coming months

ANZAC Day Tuesday 25 April

Our local Dawn Service to commemorate ANZAC Day will take place in the Kerikeri Domain on Tuesday 25 April at 5.45am. Students from Kerikeri High School will proudly be playing a leading role this year as we come together as a community to remember and acknowledge the sacrifice and service of those who have gone before us.

Work Day Friday 12 May 2023

Our 2023 Work Day is being held in Week 3, Friday 12 May. Work Day is our School's major fundraising event of the year. The proceeds of the Work Day contribute to extra facilities at our school which we are not funded. Previous years, Work Day funds have been used to purchase new school blazers, piu piu for the Kapa Haka, filtered water drinking fountains, covered walkways, landscaping and seating and purchasing of COWS (Computers on Wheels). The decision about what to spend Work Day funds on, is made by students via the Student Council. More information on Work Day will be sent out at the beginning of Term 2. We ask that you please support this important event in our school calendar by encouraging your child or children to find suitable work for Friday 12 May.

Advice on Potential Industrial Action Term 2

We have received advice from the Post Primary Teachers Association of potential industrial action in Term 2. While we are hopeful of a settlement for the Secondary Teachers Collective Contract, proposed industrial action includes a rolling oneday national strike, which in Northland would be Thursday 11 May. If this eventuates our arrangements would be the same as the two previous occasions PPTA members have been on strike; we would be closed for instruction but open for supervision of students under 14 years old.

Road Safety

A reminder to all students about being aware of road safety when travelling to and from school, especially those who are riding bikes or driving to school.

Students in Years 12 and 13 who have a Restricted License are required to have a signed parent permission form, available from Te Puna Waiora, before they can bring their car to school. We expect all student drivers to remain within the limits of their license, and this includes not travelling with passengers if the license is Restricted.

Students riding bikes to school must wear a bike helmet, and we encourage students to make themselves visible in the mornings using a light or wearing something reflective on their clothing or on their school bag.
