#### **Young Inspiring Explorers** Summit

Siena Ripohau (Year 7) was successfully chosen as one of 25 Year 7 – 9 students from across New Zealand, to attend the Young Inspiring Explorers Summit in Christchurch in November. This threeday programme is run by the Antarctic Heritage Trust and the US Embassy in New Zealand and aims to encourage and empower young, modernday explorers to meet the challenges of life headon by connecting them to the inspiring feats of early Antarctic exploration. As part of the weekend, Siena was able to meet huskies and ride in a Hägglund. She experienced a polar storm at the International Antarctic Centre and a video call and tour of the Amundsen-Scott South Pole Station. Part of the programme is to find inspiration in the legacies of historic Antarctic explorers – including experiencing Hillary's Hut - Antarctic Virtual Reality and to be challenged to step outside their comfort zone.




#### **Gerry Buxton - 2024 Kiwibank Local Hero Medallist**
