IMPORTANT MESSAGES

Nau mai, hoki mai, welcome back everyone. It is great to have everyone back at school and we are looking forward to working positively with you all again this term.

WAKA Keep ourselves Safe - Tiaki tangata. Our WAKA for Covid Level 2. By now we all have an understanding of what Covid Alert level 2 looks like in our school. As we begin Term 4, a reminder is useful.

We all have an important role to play in keeping ourselves and each other safe in our school and in our community. In our School under Alert Level 2 we keep ourselves safe by:

- Being kind to each other**
- You are encouraged to wear a face mask (however will respect everyone's personal choice on this)**
- Staying home if we are feeling ill – symptoms to be especially aware of include coughs, sore throats, sneezes, runny nose**
- Sneezing or coughing into your elbow**
- If you feel unwell at School, reporting to Te Puna Waiora. We will be contacting home to arrange for someone to collect you urgently.**
- Using Hand Sanitiser regularly**
- Regularly washing hands for 20 seconds and drying them; soap and hand drying facilities are available in every toilet and will be checked every hour**
- Cleaning shared classroom resources at end of lesson when asked to e.g., keyboards**
- Bringing your own water bottles – you cannot share food or drink**
- Not drinking directly from water fountains; you may fill your water bottle from water fountains**
- Not sharing personal items such as stationery, earphones, clothing etc**
- Respecting other people's personal space, where possible physical distancing will be encouraged**

We also need to remind students who catch buses that under Covid Alert Level 2 we must keep a register of who is catching the bus each day. Please be patient with us in the afternoon– you were all great the last two times we have had to follow this process. Buses will be called and loaded as usual and then a teacher will board the bus and quickly call the names of everyone who might be on that bus, noting who is on board. We ask that you sit quietly while we do this – it only takes a few moments.
